OVERVIEW


India is facing a rapidly growing burden of diseases, especially the non-communicable diseases (NCDs). Stroke is definitely one of them – it often goes undiagnosed and even if identified, is not addressed on time due to lack of qualified workforce and Stroke Ready Infrastructure. Every year, approximately 1.8 million people suffer from stroke, which is the second most common cause of death after coronary artery disease (CAD) globally. According to the Global Burden of Disease Study, 25.7 million people survived stroke, 6.5 million died, and 10.3 million new strokes were recorded. It also noted that the low-and middle-income countries (LMICs), of which India is a part, have witnessed more than 100 percent increase in the incidence of stroke whereas the developed countries have witnessed a drop of 42 percent.

Given the paucity of data and lack of reliable reporting mechanisms, understanding the epidemiology of stroke in India is challenging. Hence, a systematic review with an objective to investigate the incidence & prevalence, and understand the true magnitude of the problem, we need to Act Now & Fast, create a smart infrastructure at both the State and national level for better preventive measures against stroke and better rehabilitation measures for stroke-related disabilities, and make India Stroke Ready.

Rise in stroke cases: experts call for integrated approach to treatment, rehabilitation

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Delhi, Dec 19 (PTI) Noting that the incidence of stroke in India has increased almost 100 per cent in the part few decades, ognits and public health experts on Thursday called for an integrated and comprehensive approach in treatment and

At the first Stocke Summit, organised by thinktask Integrated Health and Wellbeing (IFW) Council and endorsed by Winlid Stroke Organization, experts said stroke incidence in India in higher (194-215 per 100,000 population) in rural areas when compared to the national average (119-145 per 100,000 population)

Noting that stroke is the leading cause of death in the north-eastern states, surpassing cachie problems and tithercialous, MV Padrua Servastava, chief of Neurosciences Centre at AIINEs, and it has become the 5th leading cause of death in 2016 from 12th a decade ago and claims 110-145 lives in every 100,000 population, which is alrested a 100 per cent increase.

Experts at the Stroke Summit call for an integrated approach to treatment and rehabilitation in India

Noting that the incidence of stroke has in India increased almost 100% in the past few decades, neurologists and public health experts called for an integrated and comprehensive approach to address the growing burden of stroke at the first Stroke Summit, organised by premier health think tank Integrated Health & Wellbeing (IHW) Council and endorsed by the World Stroke Organization.

Noting that stroke is the leading cause of death in north-eastern states of India, surpassing cardiac problems and tuberculosis. Dr. MV Padma Srivastava, head, Neurosciences Centre, AIIMS, said, "Stroke has become the fifth leading cause of death in 2016 from 12th cause in 1996 and claims 119-145 lives in every 1,00,000 population, which is almost a 100% increase. Our stroke burden is enormous but we need more of small, India-centric solutions. Every year, 1.8 million people suffer stroke in India, but we have only about 2000 neurologists. We need to understand and acknowledge that 'time is brain' and plug the gaps such as lack of



1. Stroke Burden in India: Socio Economic Impacts on Health Infrastructure

With around only 2000 Neurologists for 1.8 million stroke patients in India, the burden on the health infrastructure is increasing every year. India lacks a stroke ready infrastructure and workforce. This session will highlight the current scenario and reality of stroke care in India, and the socio economic impact it has on the nation.

2. Mechanical Thrombectomy scenario in India

What happens when a patient with stroke attack reaches hospital after 5 or 6 Hrs after stroke attack? In India more than 65% people lives in villages, and they need time to reach to a center where stroke attack can be treated, What is the mechanical thrombectomy model and how it is helping stroke patients and saving many lives

3. Technological Advances in Stroke Imaging, Management & Recovery

This session will highlight the role of technology in Stroke Rehabilitation & Recovery. The session will cover the technological advancements in Stroke Imaging that can help reduce the delays in treatments and provide a chance of full recovery to patients.

4. Stroke Rehabilitation & Recovery

A stroke occurs when part of the brain loses its blood supply and stops working. This causes the part of the body that the injured brain controls to stop working. People who survive a stroke have to be compelled to acquire skills they lost because of the injury. Rehabilitation helps them acquire those skills. This session will highlight the journey and possibilities for recovering from a Stroke.


